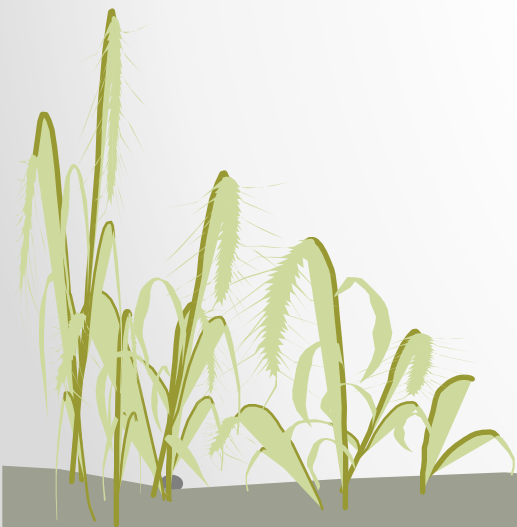

Who We Are

P22 and the camp grew out of the vision of Dr. Joseph C. Walker, a Cleveland licensed dentist who wanted teenagers to experience the rustic beauty of the out-of-doors, exposing youngsters to recreational activities that urban teens seldom experience.

The name P22 takes its inspiration from a well-known Bible verse:

Proverbs 22:6 - "Train up a child in the way he should go, And when he is old, he will not depart from it."

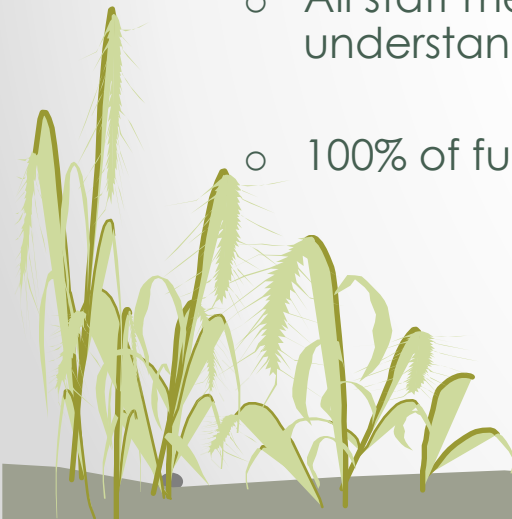




Who We Are

The organization, whose mission is to serve as a catalyst for the spiritual development of youth through Christian-based programs, has successfully recruited like-minded adult volunteers who serve as board members, camp counselors, cooks, bus and truck drivers and chaperones.

- Since 2009 P22 has provided weeklong summer camping experiences for more than 700 middle and high school youth from throughout Northeast Ohio at no cost to participants
- All staff members are volunteers and are dedicated to helping campers grow in their Christian understanding and are challenged to live out their faith.
- 100% of funding is used for the week-long camping trip including tents, cots, food, and activities





What We Do



- Several volunteers, along with the help of some of the campers, set up camp on Saturday
- The Big Top Tent serves as the central starting place for all activities.
 - Devotions – Morning and Evening
 - Dining
 - Teaching sessions
 - Counseling
 - Meeting place before off-site activities



What We Do



- Tents are set up for campers and counselors:
 - Boys camp on one side of the big tent and girls camp on the other
 - Campers sleep on cots; they are given one when they arrive and are taught how to set it up





What We Do



- Once settled in, campers and staff gather at the Big Top Tent for orientation:
 - Introductions – staff & campers
 - Camp rules
 - Camp Schedule
 - Their first teaching session on the Biblical Theme for that year

While participating in the P22 camp program, I will conduct myself in a manner which reflects positively on me, my family, and P22 camp.

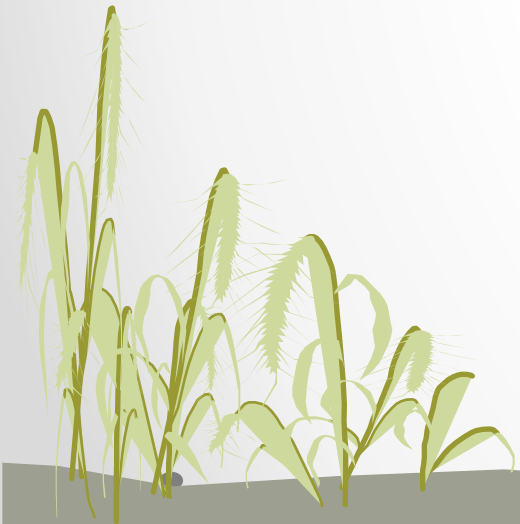
I promise to:

TEEN CAMPING RETREAT NECESSITIES

- The following is a checklist of items each camper needs to bring to the Retreat.
- **All luggage must have a “Name Identification” tag. ** It is highly recommended that all items be packed in a plastic storage tote/container no taller than 15” in height. (*Ex. Gorilla Footlocker, Sterlite Storage Totes, Rubbermaid Storage Containers, etc.*)**
- *****No electronic devices are allowed during the retreat. They will be collected and returned at the end of the retreat.**



- Bible

- Water bottle/Canteen
- Flashlight
- Sun Protection
- Insect Repellent
- Long & Short-sleeve Shirts
- Hiking Shorts
- Jacket
- Swim Trunks (Boys)

- Durable Eating Utensils
(non- disposable plate, bowl, cup, knife, fork & spoon)

*** No bikinis, belly button & mid-drift must be covered**

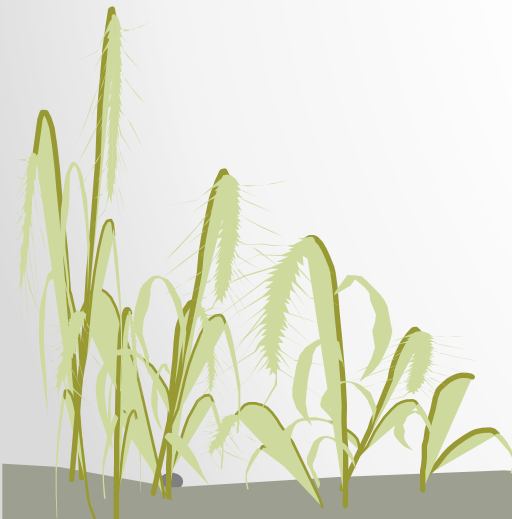
- Boating Shoes

General Releases

Acknowledgement that activities involve risk of injury

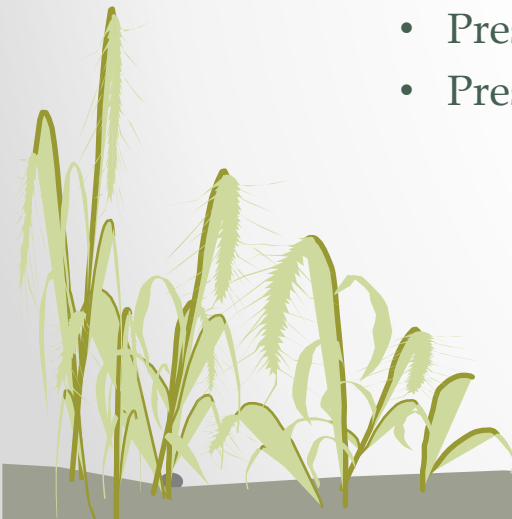
- Assume risk is involved with all activities
- Release, Waive, Discharge liability (P22 is held harmless) for:
 - Physical injury
 - Losses or damages on account of injury
 - Damage to property





Medical Releases

- Permission given to the P22 Medical Team
 - Evaluate and secure proper medical treatment including hospitalization
Knox Community Hospital Urgent Care: ~ 30 minutes from campsite
 - Administer medication including OTC & prescription
 - OTC: given per labeled dose instructions
 - Prescription: must be received from parent
 - Prescription: must be in original pharmacy labeled container with child's name and dosage





Property Search Release

Permission to search and seize property where necessary including:

- Cellphones
- Weapons
- Illegal Contraband

We strive to maintain a safe environment for all campers and staff





Conduct Release

In the event that a camper fails to abide by the rules and regulations:

- Step 1: Appropriate corrective efforts are made
- Step 2: Camper will be disengaged from all camping activities
- Step 3: Parent/Guardian will be called
 - Parent/Guardian will be allowed to pick up the child from camp
 - If parent/guardian is unable to pick up their child, a member of the staff will transport and deliver the child to their parent/guardian at a cost of \$150





Electronic Devices

Electronic devices are strictly prohibited and include:

- Cell phones
- Tablets
- Laptops
- Video games
- Any other handheld personal devices

Devices will be confiscated and secured until the end of the retreat; they will be returned to the camper or parent at the end of the retreat
